Mr. Nance called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

Approval of Agenda: A motion was made by Mr. Sprenkle and seconded by Mrs. Claflin to approve the agenda. Motion carried 7-0.

Consent Agenda: A motion was made by Mrs. Moran and seconded by Mrs. Claflin to approve the following items: Minutes of the July 9, 2018 Open Session, DWE for District Wide Evaluation Plan, CSIP/Long Range Goals, and Mission/Philosophy and bills Motion carried 7-0.

MSBA Report: The monthly video was watched.

Financial Report:

- **Bills:** The board reviewed the bills. Mr. Lamb made a motion to pay the bills. Mrs. Byram seconded the motion and the motion carried with 7-0.
- **Balance:** Mr. Irwin reviewed the balance for the board.
- **Budget:** Mr. Irwin informed the board Mrs. Laning has submitted the ASBR and all is good with the budget.

Facilities Report: Mr. Irwin discussed the new doors with the board, as well as what to do about the locks. Mr. Irwin informed the board of the new gravel that was put down in the parking lot, and the new PA system has been installed which the Alumni paid for.

New Business:

- **Fuel Bids:** MFA was the only fuel bid received, Mr. Nance made a motion to accept the bid. Mr. Lamb seconded the motion and the motion carried 7-0.
- **Code of Ethics:** Mr. Lamb made a motion to approve the Code of Ethics. Mr. Nance seconded the motion and the motion carried 7-0.
- **Bus Routes:** Mr. Nance made a motion to approve the bus routes. Mr. Lamb seconded the motion and the motion carried 7-0.
- **Vernon Co. Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan:** After some discussion, Mr. Lamb made a motion to approve the plan. Mr. Nance seconded the motion, motion carried 7-0.
- **First National Bank Signatures:** Mr. Irwin informed the board that the signatures at First National needed to be updated. After some discussion, Mr. Leininger made a motion to change the signatures to Mr. Irwin and Ms. Coquillette. Mrs. Claflin seconded the motion, motion carried 7-0. The FFA CD was also discussed, Mrs. Claflin made a motion to cash out the CD and put the money in the AG/FFA account. Mrs. Byram seconded the motion and the motion carried 7-0.
- **Sub Pay:** Mr. Irwin asked the board to raise the rate for substitutes to \$75 per day. After some discussion, Mr. Nance made a motion to increase the rate to \$75, Mrs. Claflin seconded the motion. The

motion carried 6-1.

- **Transfer Fund 1 to Fund 4:** Mr. Irwin asked the board to approve a transfer of \$20,000 from Fund 1 to Fund 4 to cover the expense of the new doors. Mr. Lamb made the motion to approve the transfer, Mr. Nance seconded and the motion carried 7-0.

Admission Policy

(Revised on 6-12-18)

Adults: \$3

Students: \$1

***Age 65 and older: Free**

The following personnel should be admitted without charge to athletic events.

1. Stockton Courtesy Passes (regular season games only, NO tournaments).
2. Stockton Family/Individual Passes (regular season games only, NO tournaments).
3. MLC Passes (conference games only).
4. All school employees, board members, their spouse and children living at home (in school).
5. Students designated to perform and/or other people performing.
6. Game workers (concession, clock, announcer, etc.)

7. College scouts, High School Coaches and Administrators.
8. All Law Enforcement personnel, doctors and ambulance attendants (on duty-in uniform).

RE-ENTRY RULE:

1. Adults may leave and re-enter free of charge.
2. Students who leave must pay to re-enter, unless they are with their parent.
 - *This includes all school employees' children also.*
