Describe activities

The Sheldon School District works to attract highly qualified teachers by providing them with a mentor for two years following the PDC mentoring Program. The district encourages teachers to attend workshops to support their certification. Teachers are allowed time to observe successful classroom practices in or out of the district. The district provides support and information for all teachers and paras to become highly qualified. The district will pay the cost of the certification tests when successfully passed for alternative certification needed for a teaching assignment. Teachers are encouraged and supported to continue their education. The district provides benefits such as health insurance, life insurance, and personal days. Attractive classrooms with resources such as Smartboards, teacher and student computers, and online resource packages help to attract highly qualified teachers to our district. Administrators attend college placement days and post job openings on the school website and Mo Teaching Jobs site.
